Guilford Technical Community College - T.H. Davis Aviation Center

Guilford Technical Community College (GTCC) is the home of the T.H. Davis Aviation Center. Located on the Piedmont Triad International Airport campus, the Center provides students hands-on aviation experience and offers customized, industry-specific training for companies. The Center's partnership with Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University allows graduates to pursue advanced aviation degrees.



North Carolina A&T State University (NC A&T) graduates the largest number of African-American engineers, women engineers and Ph.D.s in the nation. Aviation-related offerings include:

- **The Center for Aerospace Research** partners with NASA to conduct research about the exploration of space and the long-term human presence in space.
- **National Institute of Aerospace (NIA)**, formed by a consortium of leading research universities including NC A&T, conducts leading-edge aerospace and atmospheric research.
- **The Advanced Composite Training Center** trains students in composite mechanics and composite materials processing.

Expecting An Overnight Success
