

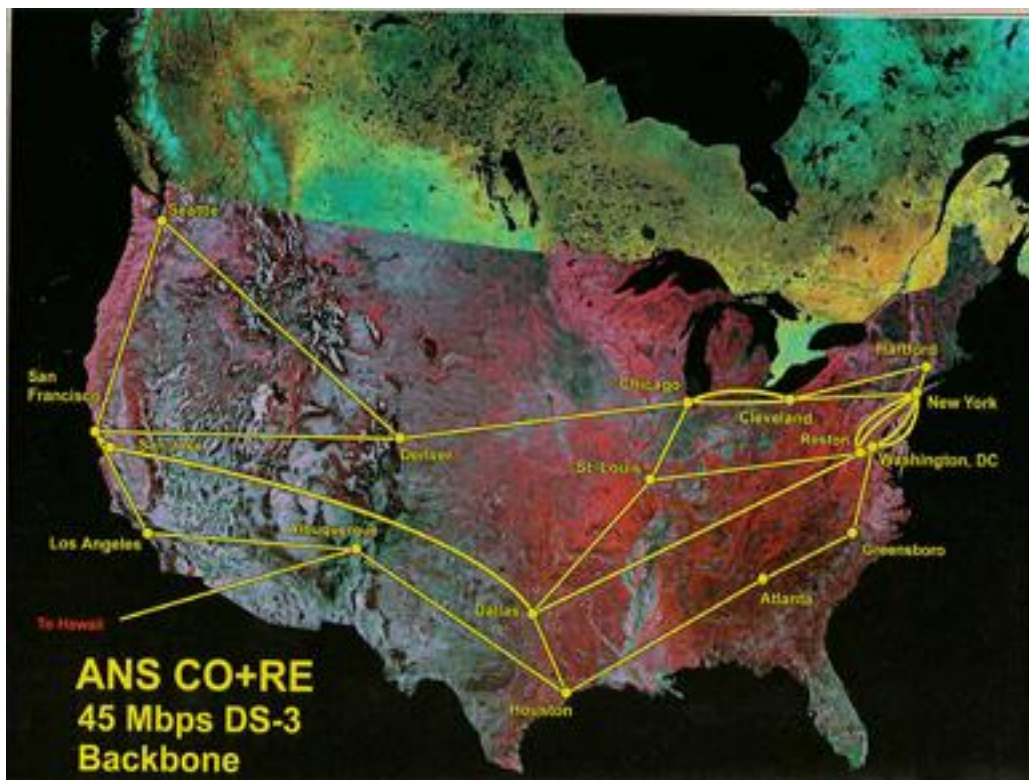
Internet Backbone
